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Spring to Healthy Skin & Coat

Finally, the snow has ceased and the sun is beginning to show its lovely yellow face again. It's been a long winter for us and our pets, and we at HealthyPetNet suspect that they're in need of some good old fashioned spring grooming! But first, let's learn about the intricacies of our pets' coats so that we can have a greater understanding of what keeps our pets' hair healthy and what doesn't.

Some Hairy Questions

Have you ever wondered what hair really is and what it's made of? After all, it grows straight out of our skin! Where does it come from? Why do we have it? Why should it be important to us? How do we best take care of it? And what can we learn from it?

Merriam-Webster's Collegiate Dictionary defines hair as "a slender threadlike outgrowth of the epidermis of an animal; especially one of the usually pigmented filaments that form the characteristic coat of a mammal." This is a very basic definition for the millions of prickly things that sprout out of the epidermis, which is the top layer of the skin. Hair grows in bunches from follicles, which can best be described as slim cavernous wells, deep down inside our skin. The depth of follicles depends on the thickness of the hair and the location of the hair on the body. On humans for instance, the follicles in our eyebrows are not likely to be as deep as the follicles in our scalp.

Hair is almost completely made up of small amounts of minerals and keratin proteins, the sulfur-containing fibrous proteins that also form our nails. Hair also contains melanin, the pigment located in the hair cortex that colors the hair. Melanin is also the pigment that colors our skin.

Our pets' coats serve as a layer of insulation between their skin and the external environment. Not only does it protect them from the cold temperatures in the winter, but it also protects them from heat in the summer. For cats in particular, hair can also be a display of aggressiveness. Have you ever seen the shadow of a cat on the wall when it is frightened or threatened? Their hair raises like the dead from its back.

Grooming Our Pets' Coats

It is no wonder that when we are on the search for a new pet, we almost instinctively look at the condition of the animal's coat. A pet's hair is often an outward manifestation of what is going on inside the body. Pets plagued with excessive hair loss, the flaky presence of dandruff and dry brittle coats are probably experiencing some sort of deficiency in their diets and should be taken to a vet for thorough examination. However, while we are doing the internal work by feeding them balanced diets and supplements, there are things that we can do on the outside to keep our pets' coats looking glossy and full of life.



The grooming process comes in two parts, if you don't include brushing their teeth. The first part is the act of shampooing the coat and the other is combing and brushing. The importance of regular grooming far transcends the actual functions themselves. Not only does it keep our pets looking and feeling good, but it's also an opportunity to take a close look at our pets and check for parasites, sores and inconspicuous wounds all the while maintaining the human-animal bond.

If you have a young pet, it would be in your best interest as an owner to start and maintain a grooming schedule so that your pet becomes used to the routine. This especially pertains to cats, who we know are finicky particularly when it comes to water. It is also important to instill in your pet that grooming is serious business and not play time. In terms of frequency, though daily brushing isn't necessary for every breed of cat or dog, we stress that long-haired breeds should receive daily attention,

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especially now that spring is knocking on our doors and they are inevitably going to be spending more time outside, which makes them more prone to parasites, dirt, cuts and who *knows* what else!

Shorthaired breeds of dogs and cats may only need to be brushed once a week. The amount of time put into grooming longhaired pets versus shorthaired pets should be a major factor when trying to decide which kind of breed to buy, if you are searching.

Seven Steps to Grooming

Before we begin, we strongly advise you against using household cleaning products for bathing your pets, as they are harsh and abrasive to their skin. Plus, they will dry out the hair considerably. Nor do we suggest products formulated for humans. Pets have a different skin pH. We suggest that you use a product like our Herbal Blend Shampoo, a product formulated especially for dogs and cats.

1. Prepare everything before actually bathing your pet. Have all of the necessary materials such as brushes, combs and towels nearby.
2. Half-fill your tub or a suitable container with warm water, making sure you have a prepared supply for rinsing. Slowly put your pet into the warm water and use a jug, faucet or extended bathing faucet to wet him or her.
3. Rub the shampoo into your pet's coat and massage thoroughly to get rid of the dead hairs. Don't use shampoo on the head because it could get into the eyes. Just wash the head with a wash cloth.
4. Rinse the shampoo from the coat thoroughly. At this point, prepare to get a little shower yourself. Your dog or cat will most likely shake herself furiously to get rid of the excess water.
5. Dry your pet with a clean towel. For a longhaired breed of pet, you may want to use a

hairdryer on a low temperature setting. A hairdryer with a brush attached speeds up the drying process.

6. Groom with a comb or a brush. For shorthaired pets, use a short bristled brush and for longhaired breeds, start with big blunt toothed comb to detangle and cut any matted areas with a blunt-ended scissors. Groom your pet from the head downward, brushing in the direction of the hair growth. Brushing in the wrong direction, however, is wonderful for stimulating the oils.
7. If you can run a comb through your pet's hair without any kinks and snags, then you have groomed your pet thoroughly!

The Hairball Phenomenon

Spring to Healthy Skin & Coat

Our pets' coats are not static things. They are constantly changing before our unseeing eyes. The act of shedding is a completely natural process that is in absolute accordance with the natural world. In the late days of autumn, flowers and leaves crinkle and die and in the spring they are reborn. Our pets' coats in their own right also go through this cycle of life. The changes in our pets' coats are mostly gradual, though it depends on the lifestyle, health condition and activity of the pet. Some hair follicles are simultaneously programmed to rest in groups, as if on strike. This causes hair to drop out in large numbers. This is especially true during seasonal changes when the genius of our pets' bodies is preparing to keep cool or keep warm. Of course, temperature changes are going to greater affect dogs and cats that spend most of their time outdoors. The average outdoor pet can drop thousands of hairs a day during seasonal changes.

Also, if your pet's diet isn't balanced and doesn't contain enough protein, then their hair will be generally weaker and more prone to fall out. Indoor pets usually have shedding periods that are less obvious and shed all year round. This is just further reason to groom our pets regularly. For longhaired pets, daily brushing eliminates chances of matted, tangled hair, which is often responsible for skin diseases and irritations. Dead, tangled hair traps dirt, debris and odor inside the animal's coat. Brushing and combing regularly also reduces excessive shedding, which means less hair to clean up all over the house!

The Cat: A Special Case

Have you ever felt a cat's tongue on your arm? If so, then you're all too familiar with that strange, sandpapery sensation you feel as they rub their tongue up and down the landscape of your skin. The rough barbs of a cat's tongue are designed for grooming their own

coats. In fact, cats spend one-third of their lives grooming themselves. What vanity!

Because of the texture of their tongues, which can be compared to Velcro snatching and grabbing loose, dead hair, cats tend to digest a lot of their own coats. Even hairless cats swallow a lot of hair around the house, especially houses with other pets. Because hair is hard to digest, it compacts with undigested food and can accumulate in the intestines. Often, cats cough up messy hairballs in the shape of cigars all over the house. If your cat doesn't cough up hair from time to time or excrete traces of it in their feces, then it's more than likely your cat's intestines are choked with hair. This can lead to constipation, which can turn into impaction, sickness and potential surgery. When surgically removed, hairballs often reach up to three inches in diameter!

A Pet's Grief Over the Loss of His Friend

I've had my monkey Wally for years, ever since I saved him from an atrocious abuse case. When I took him in, at first it was hard for him to get used to me; he was so traumatized and afraid of humans because of everything he had been through in his rough past. It took a lot of patience on both of our parts to be able to coexist with each other. Plus, he was constantly going through feelings of abandonment; monkeys live in troops consisting anywhere from ten to a hundred! He hadn't been around another monkey since he was a baby. Poor Wally. He was in desperate need of a friend.

At the time, I had three cats and Wally became fond of one special boy named Croton. He didn't really care for the other two. If the cats came near him or Croton, he would often chase them away. After a year of a beautiful friendship, Croton took sick and died soon after. I thought it was only right to allow Wally to say goodbye to him properly. When he saw Croton lying in the coffin, he tried to lift him out. It was heartbreaking for both of us. Since Wally didn't care for the two other cats, I adopted a cat named Jedi as a new companion for him. Jedi stayed with us for several years and then passed away. Soon after, I brought home an adorable cat named Spot. Spot had been suffering from skin cancer for a couple of years. He was all white with black spots, which is how he got his name. The pair grew to love one another immensely. They would hang out together on the porch. It was an adorable sight to see! Wally would grab Spot by the ear when a stranger came over or when he was afraid. Sometimes he would just sit really close to him. For the most part, he just needed to be in the same room.

Sometimes when I called out to Spot, Wally would come instead. Spot was an independent, hardheaded cat that didn't always come when I asked him to. However, when Wally and I played ball, Spot would come and play, too. When Spot ate, Wally ate. Sometimes, instead of eating his own food, Wally would push Spot away and try to eat Spot's food. It was so cute and funny! The most charming thing of all was at bedtime. Instead of sleeping with me in the bed, Spot would often sleep on a blanket on the floor next to Wally's cage, where Wally slept at night. My favorite thing to wake up to in the mornings was Spot sleeping with his cheek nestled against the side of Wally's cage.

Eventually the skin cancer that Spot's body had been fighting spread into his nose and his mouth. It got so bad that I could no longer stand the thought of Spot suffering. I couldn't bear putting Spot to sleep myself, so I called my friend, another veterinarian. As we waited for my friend to come over, Wally stayed by Spot's side the entire time. He knew his friend was suffering and he could not leave him. He even refused to eat his breakfast. When the vet finally came, I had to lure Wally into his cage with his favorite piece of candy. I covered his cage with a blanket so that he would not see us take Spot from the house.

These days, Wally sulks and will not eat very much. I miss the times when he used to eat at the table with me and the way he used to grab his food off the plate, eat it and then throw it down on the ground for his favorite cat, whether it was Croton, Jedi or Spot. He hasn't done this in weeks, even though I already adopted another feline companion, who he hasn't warmed up to yet. I'm worried about him because he's 19 years



old, which is like an old man in human terms. He has aged rapidly in these past few weeks; his face is drawn with noticeable grey and he hardly jumps anymore. He's been clinging to me more than ever before, looking up at me with sad, liquid eyes. This experience has taught me what I have always known. Animals experience loss when another member of the household goes away or goes to heaven. They are no less emotionally aware than humans. Sometimes, even more so. When our pets are grieving, they need our extra love and support to get them through it.

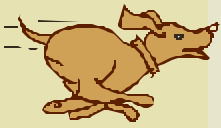
